### [January 2010](#)

#### **Print- Element Of Design**

This is geared more for the close up/cropped shots. Shadows on the wall, design on a pineapple, Christmas ornament, tile floor, brick, fern leaf, bamboo, close up of a screen or mesh, giraffe spots, zebra stripes, wood grain, sand lines, water.

#### **Internet- Light**

Sun (sunrise, sunset), sunrays, candle, moon, lamp, street light, any light source.

### [February 2010](#)

#### **Print - Nostalgia**

Anything to do with memories, old or new. To return to some ones past period, something dear to your heart. Photo albums, old books, theaters, drive inn, nostalgia turn tables, typewriter, old hats, old clothes, old door, old building, an elderly person.

#### **Internet - Aeronautical**

Anything in flight, birds soaring, aircraft, motion of air (trees swaying), balloons, kite, hand glider.

**Aeronautics** (from [Greek](#) *aero* which means air or sky and *nautis* which means sailor, I.e. Sailor of the air or sky) is the [science](#) involved with the study, design, and manufacture of [flight](#)-capable machines, or the techniques of operating [aircraft](#). While the term—literally meaning "sailing the air"—originally referred solely to the science of *operating* the aircraft, it has since been expanded to include technology, business and other aspects related to aircraft.<sup>[1]</sup> One of the significant parts in aeronautics is a branch of [physical science](#) called [aerodynamics](#), which deals with the motion of [air](#) and the way that it interacts with objects in motion, such as an aircraft. **Aviation** is a term sometimes used interchangeably with aeronautics, although "aeronautics" includes lighter-than-air craft such as [airships](#), while "aviation" does not.<sup>[1]</sup>

### [March 2010](#)

#### **Print - Your Back Yard/Your Town**

Children playing in your yard, your local park, local birds, your town square, local bank, courthouse, water tower, close up or faraway shots of anything going on in your town.

#### **Internet - Street Scenes**

Festival, parades, people walking down the street/road, peddlers, traffic on the street/road, workers on the road/street.

### [April 2010](#)

#### **Print - Insects/small critters**

Bee, grasshopper, fly, frog, lizard, turtle, rodent, skunk (if you dare to get that close) armadillo, rabbit.

#### **Internet - H2O**

Anything to do with water. Water drops, rain, ice melting, lakes, creeks, ponds, baby taking bubble bath, bubbles, animals bathing or you taking a bath but please no nudity, no surprise shower shots.

## **Print - Texas Highways**

Road side parks, famous highways, route 66, DOT construction workers, wrecks, bridges, mix-master, blue bonnet, different things that happen on the highways.

## **Internet - Graffiti/Murals**

Graffiti is not planned to be there but murals are. Buildings, trains, signs, bridge underpass.

## **June 2010**

### **Print - Environmental**

Anything that changes the land or organism from what it was to something different, disrupts. Refinery, pipe line, rust, water sprinkler, people plowing the field, garbage dump, tire dump, erosion, ill-legal dump area. This can be faraway or close up shots.

### **Internet - Year Challenge**

Everyone will do the same things. Find letters of the alphabet in ordinary, everyday things/items. No limit, if you find only 1 or 2 different letters or 5, 8 and so on letters of the alphabet it doesn't matter. Then make a simple or complex collage. This will be a lot of fun and be a creative challenge and it also gears toward digital manipulation, layers (which we can do with the internet entries) and remember these can be used for the fair as well. There are free editing programs and a world of information on the web. Diane also has graciously agreed to type up instructions and hand them out if you want them.

## **July 2010**

### **Print - Transport**

Anything that transports someone or something from one place to another. Train, train tracks, carriage, taxi, road, horse skates, skateboard, wings of a bird, escalator, steps, staircase, wagon, tractor, elephant, donkey.

### **Internet - Urbanscape**

Drinking water fountain/fountain, cityscape, bridge, roads, fire escape, rustic, restaurant, staircase to a building. Anything to do with city or urban/rural.

## **August 2010**

### **Print - Food (still life)**

Pizza, meat, canned foods, jellies, fruit, candy, anything edible.

### **Internet - Farmers Market**

Fruits, veggies, watermelon, pumpkins. This covers outside vendors. Some examples are, they may be set up on the side of the road with a stand or out of the back of their truck, car, wagon ect.

## **September 2010**

### **Print - Sports/Motion/Action**

Motorcycle, horse races, trains, automobiles, rodeo/cowboys, football, baseball, soccer, running, waterfalls, butterflies, clocks.

### **Internet - Animals/Wildlife**

Anything in captivity(domestic) or in the wild, dogs, cats, pig, turtle, roadrunner, snake, goat, cow, horse, cheetah, lion, deer.

## October 2010

### **Print - Fall Scenes**

Fall colors, pumpkin patch, pumpkin farm, apple orchard, trees, leaves.

### **Internet - Halloween**

Anything goes basically everyone starts setting up at the beginning of Oct, so get out there and get some shots or use last Oct. Remember you can go back two years, ghost, trick or treat candy, goblins, spooky haunted houses, carnival, homes decorated, kids costumes, Halloween candy isle in the store (if they let you in with a camera), this subject would be perfect for some creative digital manipulation for the internet.

## November 2010

### **Print - Winter Scene**

Snow, ice, smoke coming out of a chimney, camp fire, people cutting logs, frozen water, dead trees.

### **Internet - Contrast**
